Be respectful. Commencement is both a joyous and formal event. Express your excitement in ways that will not prevent others from hearing the speaker and enjoying the ceremony. The use of air horns, yelling, or stomping are disruptive.

Photo opportunities. Graduates, please limit selfies to your time in the audience. In an effort to keep the program moving no selfies or photos should be taken on stage.

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

TONY BROTHERS

NBA Official



Tony Brothers is entering his 31st season as an NBA official and has officiated 1,800 regular season games and over 200 playoff games, including 13 NBA Finals appearances. He was a member of the crew that officiated the 1996 Mexico Challenge, 1998 Schick Rookie All-star Game, 1999 McDonald's Championship in Milan, Italy, 2008 NBA China Games, 2009 and 2024 NBA All-star Games and the 2014 Global Games in Berlin and Turkey, 2018 NBA BWB Africa Games and the 2018 NBA China Games.

To honor his late mother Dorothy Brothers, a former Bank of America Executive and member of the

Minority Business Hall of Fame and Museum, and to give back to his community, Tony co-founded, Still Hope Foundation, Inc., now Journey for Success. Journey for Success is an organization that seeks to assist single mothers in building a solid and successful family unit by offering quality resources and supportive relationships. In 2007, he established the Dorothy B. Brothers Women's Center at the Norfolk, Virginia, campus of Tidewater Community College. In September 2015, he established Men for Hope, Inc. to (S)upport under served men, (O)rganize men's efforts in the community, and (W)ork with organizations providing services for single women parenting young men – the SOW concept. As a tax-exempt 501 (c) (3) public charity, Men for Hope endeavors to "SOW seeds" through mentorship and resources that promote education, financial literacy, and self-fulfillment. In 2018, he established the Dorothy B. Brothers Endowment at Norfolk State University to assist children of single-parent households at NSU. He also established the Dorothy B. Brothers Auditorium and the Tony and Kimberly Brothers Multipurpose Room on the campus of NSU as a tribute to his late mother.

Brothers attended Old Dominion University, where he earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration/Management Information Systems in 1986 and a Master of Public Administration degree in 2022. In 2014, he was the recipient of the ODU Distinguished Alumni Award. In 2018, he was selected to deliver the fall commencement address at Norfolk State University, where he received an Honorary Doctorate in Humane Letters. In 2020, he was chosen to deliver the first virtual commencement address for Thomas Nelson Community College. In 2021, he was appointed to the Hampton Roads Regional Arena Authority by Gov. Ralph Northam. In 2023, he was inducted into the Hampton Roads Sports Hall of Fame. He resides in Norfolk, Va., where he owns Brothers Restaurant and finds time to support his favorite football team, ODU!

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Founded in 1968 as a part of the Virginia Community College System, Tidewater Community College (TCC) has successfully moved into the next semicentennial.

The College served 23,435 students in 2023, making it the second largest community college in Virginia. Nearly 33% of recent public high school graduates in South Hampton Roads made TCC their college of choice.

TCC's diverse student body ranges in age from teenagers to senior citizens, with an average age of 24. Nearly 60% of students are women. With minority enrollment at 56%, TCC is a proud minority serving institution. Military-related students represent about a third of its enrollment.

TCC has campuses in Chesapeake, Norfolk, Portsmouth, and Virginia Beach. Its regional centers include the new Visual Arts & Design Center and Jeanne and George Roper Performing Arts Center in downtown Norfolk; Advanced Technology Center, Center for Military and Veterans Education, and Regional Health Professions Center on its Virginia Beach Campus; Regional Automotive Center in Chesapeake; Regional Workforce Solutions Center in Suffolk; and the Skilled Trades Academy in Portsmouth.

The college's regional accreditation is affirmed through 2027 by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges. Additionally, 13 of TCC's academic programs are recognized for their excellence by national accrediting organizations.

THE ACADEMIC REGALIA

The history of academic dress reaches back to 12th and 13th century Britain and Europe, where the dress of the scholar, whether student or teacher, was that of a cleric. In 15th century Britain, Oxford and Cambridge universities first began prescribing academic dress and made it a matter of university control—even to the extent of minor details and punishments for tailors who deviated from the standards.

Today, the gown, cap, and hood signify the privileges and responsibilities of the scholar. While European universities show great diversity in academic dress, American colleges and universities have followed a single standard since 1895.

The gown is a symbol of the democracy of scholarship, as it covers dress indicating rank or social standing. Associate, bachelor's and master's degree gowns have no trimming; the doctoral robe is faced with velvet and has velvet bars on the sleeves.

The cap, symbolizing freedom of scholarship, descends from the pileus, the favored headgear of medieval clerics. Two varieties of the pileus are common at American colleges and universities—the soft, beret-like Tudor bonnet and the more common Oxford cap, or "mortarboard." The tassel on the cap may be black or the color of the wearer's learning discipline or institution. Graduates wear the tassel on the front left side after degrees are conferred. Numerous institutions, including TCC, have adopted the practice of having graduates shift their tassels from right to left in unison upon conferring of the degrees.

The academic hood, which descends from cowls worn by monks to ward off cold drafts in their monasteries, is worn by those holding bachelor's, master's, and doctorate degrees. Color may denote the wearer's academic discipline or college or university.

TCC regalia features a blue robe, blue mortarboard with silver and blue tassel, and silver stole with the college seal. Graduates may also wear one or more of the following:

- Cords whose colors represent a graduate's degree (the first color is the primary)
 - » Certificate/Diploma: red and green
 - » Associate of Applied Science: green and blue
 - » Associate of Applied Arts: blue and green
 - » Associate of Arts: red and blue
 - » Associate of Fine Arts: brown and blue
 - » Associate of Science: blue and red
- Gold cords, denoting graduation with honors
- Red, white and royal blue braided cords, honoring active-duty military, veterans, spouses and other military-related students
- Gold stoles and medals, worn by members of the Phi Theta Kappa honor society
- Medals with burgundy and yellow ribbon, worn by members of the National Society of Collegiate Scholars
- White stoles, worn by elected and appointed officers and senators of the Student Government Association
- Kente cloth stoles of black, yellow, green, and red, worn by participants in the Open Door Project
- Governor's Medallions, worn by dual-enrollment students who have completed a degree or certificate
- Turquoise and royal blue braided cords, worn by TCC Student Ambassadors
- Teal and gold cords worn by Accelerated Degree graduates
- Rust cords worn by STEM graduates
- Blue and silver "school spirit" cords

THE ACADEMIC BANNERS

The gonfalon, a banner that hangs from a crosspiece or frame, originated in the medieval republics of Italy as an authoritative emblem of state or office. Gonfalons have been adopted by many colleges and universities around the world as academic banners to display college or institutional insignias, as well as to identify and lead colleges and schools within an institution in academic processions.

TCC's six gonfalons represent the degrees (Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, Associate of Fine Arts, Associate of Applied Arts, and Associate of Applied Science) and certificates awarded by TCC.

TCC's gonfalons consist of a broad center panel ending in a fishtail below, with angled, narrower side panels of a contrasting color. The college's logo and tagline appear at the bottom of the central panel, with the name of the academic degree at the top.



THE MACE AND THE MEDALLION

The academic mace is a traditional ceremonial staff that serves as a symbol of authority. Tidewater Community College's mace is a gift from Old Dominion University, which, in 1999, commissioned its creation by James C. Chalkley, a professional artist serving as an adjunct art faculty member at TCC's Visual Arts Center. This enduring gift, crafted of silver and crystal, is a token of the shared goals and strong working relationship between the two institutions. The intersecting facets forming the head of the mace represent the college's four-campus, unified structure.

The President's Medallion is a traditional academic symbol of the authority and responsibility of the Office of the President.

The three and a half-inch, silver plated medallion features the Tidewater Community College Seal. In addition, small pearls circle the medallion, reflecting the wisdom and knowledge imparted by the President. The medallion is worn by the President with academic regalia at commencement and other formal college ceremonies.
